# Proposed Waitomo Service Station - West Street, SH1, Ashburton - Waitomo Energy Limited

Thank you for your request for written approval from Waka Kotahi New Zealand Transport Agency (Waka Kotahi). Your proposal has been considered as follows:

# <u>Proposal</u>

Resource consent is sought for the following activities:

- To construct and operate a new self-serve service station on land designated for railway purposes, which is legally
  described as Part Reserve 953, Canterbury. The subject site is 5.7ha in area, however, Waitomo Energy Limited will
  lease an area of 1535m<sup>2</sup> for the proposed service station.
- The forecourt will include four dispenser locations, which will provide a total of 8 filling locations.
- Two vehicle crossings are proposed directly onto State Highway 1, which will operate on a one-way basis. The
  northern vehicle crossing will be 12m wide and be used for entry only and the southern vehicle crossing will be 11m
  wide and used as an exit only. The vehicle crossing will be constructed to a heavy-duty standard and designed for Btrain vehicles that will use the site. Full detail design of the vehicle crossings will be submitted as part of the Corridor
  Access Request (CAR).
- Appropriate signage at the vehicle crossings, which include 'No-Entry' and 'No-Exit' signs, have been proposed to reinforce the one-way operation through the site. Painted directional arrows will also be displayed on the property at each vehicle crossing.
- A sign will be displayed on the southern end of the property to direct heavy vehicle traffic to exit 'left turn only' out of the southern vehicle crossing. This sign is intended to deter heavy vehicles exiting the site by turning right and waiting in the flush median, which could result in the overhanging of a vehicle in the southbound lane of State Highway 1.
- An internally illuminated double-sided pylon sign will be located wholly within the property adjacent to State Highway 1. The sign will be 5.4m high and 2m wide, with a total surface area of 10.8m<sup>2</sup>. The sign will display the Waitomo logo, prices for each type of fuel that will be displayed via LED and wording that states the site operates as a 24/7 service.
- The proposal will also include landscaping as per attachment 5, stormwater disposal that will be collected on site and treated before being discharged to the Council's reticulated stormwater network, and earthworks associated with construction.

## Assessment

In assessing the proposed activity, Waka Kotahi notes the following:

• The location of the site and associated vehicle crossings were assessed with consideration given to the Walnut Avenue intersection upgrade project that is currently under construction. It is confirmed that the site is sufficiently distanced from the project area and will not likely impact the infrastructure being constructed.

- The proposed southern vehicle crossing is located adjacent to an existing vehicle crossing to the south, which provides
  access to the KiwiRail yard. It is also located across from a vehicle crossing to the Ashburton Domain. The impact of
  the use of the proposed service station on the safe operation of these nearby vehicle crossings has been assessed
  and it is considered that they should not be adversely affected.
- It was identified that there could be a risk on the safe operation of the State Highway if an exiting heavy vehicle was
  attempting to right turn out of the site and sitting in the flush median. This could result in the vehicle overhanging into
  the southbound lane, which could block traffic and have an impact on the new signalised intersection with Walnut Ave.
  The applicant has agreed to include signage to reduce this risk.
- To ensure that the site operates as a one-way system, in consultation with Waka Kotahi the applicant agreed to include appropriate signage at the vehicle crossings and painted directional arrows within the site. This has been amended in the site plan as per attachment 1.
- The proposed pylon sign will be consistent with the lettering height requirements of the District Plan to ensure that the consent of the sign is visible to motorists. It is position as to not obstruct sight distances along State Highway 1. The number of words on the sign exceeds the Waka Kotahi recommended requirements of 6 words. However, it has been advised that pylon signs associated with fuel stations are not likely to be a safety issue or a distracting feature to motorists.
- The landscaping plan has been assessed and confirm that this will not obstruct sightlines or shade the State Highway.

## Limited Access Road (LAR)

Your client's site adjoins State Highway 1, which is identified as a limited access road. Per Section 91 of the Government Roading Powers Act 1989, to access your client's site your client requires a crossing place authorised by the Waka Kotahi. In this instance both the northern and southern vehicle crossing will require individual crossing place notices. These can be issued by Waka Kotahi once confirmation is received that the vehicle crossings have been constructed to the standard proposed in the application.

#### **Determination**

On the basis of the above assessment of the proposed activity, Waka Kotahi provides written approval under section 95E of the Resource Management Act 1991.

### Advice Notes

Before you undertake any physical work on the state highway, including the formation of any vehicle crossing, you are legally required to apply to Waka Kotahi for a Corridor Access Request (CAR) and for that request to be approved.

Please submit your CAR to the Waka Kotahi CAR Manager via <u>www.beforeudig.co.nz</u> and/or <u>www.submitica.co.nz</u> a minimum of fourteen working days prior to the commencement of any works on the state highway; longer is advised for complex works.

As the property has access to a limited access road, once the works have been completed to the satisfaction of Waka Kotahi NZ Transport Agency's Network Manager, crossing place notices per Section 91 of the Government Roading Powers Act 1989 will be registered on the title confirming the legal establishment of the crossing places.

#### Expiry of this approval

Unless resource consent has been obtained this approval will expire two years from the date of this approval letter. This approval will lapse at that date unless prior agreement has been obtained from Waka Kotahi.
