Why?:	Diverting household foodwaste from the landfill reduces greenhouse emissions. Landfills are not long term solutions. A kerbside collection system would be useful for people who don't have space for composting or chickens, particulary in higher density residential areas which will be more common in the future. Not all households have insinkerators. Using insinkerators for food waste pushes this waste load onto our sewage sytems and ultimately to the landfill.

Combined they will make better compost.
Do you have any other comments?:	I don't support an opt in/opt out system. This would be complex to administer particularly for properties with high tenancy turnovers. An opt in/opt out system has not been applied for general waste and recycling and foodwaste and I can't see why foodwaste should be treated differently. Providing all households with the a foodwaste

kerbside collection is more likely to divert a greater amount of foodwaste from the landfill.
