5 Reports/Agency Updates

5.1 Ashburton District Road Safety

Discussions were held on the permanent 30km speed limits around urban schools. Council have requested a review on the effectiveness of retaining these permanent speed limits. It is expected that this report will be presented to Council in February 2024.

5.2 Waka Kotahi/NZTA

Melcombe Street Safety Platforms

The safety aspect of the raised platforms on Melcombe Street being installed in such close proximity to intersections was discussed. How the locations were decided was questioned, Officers to follow up with designers to clarify decision making process.

It was advised that following such projects it is customary for a safety audit to be undertaken. Committee members were encouraged to share any concerns which will be included in the audit.

5.3 Ia Ara Aotearoa/Transporting NZ

Tinwald Effluent Dump Site

Investigations as to alternate rural sites for the Tinwald effluent dump station are currently being worked through including funding options.

5.4 Automobile Association

The 'Be Safe – Be Seen' cycle campaign has been working well. The current supply of lights has been allocated to schools through the district, from Hokitika to Hanmer. Local schools that have benefited from the programme are Tinwald, Chertsey and St Joseph's. Additional funding options to enable the purchase of more lights are being investigated.
