My sport many years ago was that of mountaineering, with other members of the Nelson Alpine Club I was able to climb many of the peaks about Nelson and the Nelson lakes national Park. As I was involved in dairy farming in those times most of the climbs were winter climbs, on the lesser peaks this was not a problem except for the fact of shorter days. On numerous occasions we would tramp up Lake Rotoiti in the evening to be ready for a good start the next day, while we had torch's we would use carbide lamps the most, I hope my carbide lamp is still in the shed at the farm, I must search for it, polish it well and place it on a sideboard in my dwelling. I do have my two ice axes and crampons, plus my antiquated mountain pack, the sort of thing no tramper would carry today. Some day I will sort the many 35mm slides I have and get them presented in a better more modern manner.

So much for my mountaineering days of the 1960's. I have occupied myself with reading which I spend time often late into the night working at as well as the time I spend in cafes and restaurants when I take a book to read. the place we went back to.' The Small town is Krakowiec, pronounced Krah-KOV-yets. Eastern Europe is not an easy area to read about and to learn of, in fact following the story so far has been hard work with having to refer to earlier pages from time to time, names have changed and changed back, but I have found it worth pursuing and really very good reading. As an example, the Ukraine city we know of today as Lviv was called Lwow by the Poles who ruled it before 1772 and again in the interwar period. The Austrian who governed it from 1772 to 1918 called it Lemberg as did its Germain occupiers between 1941 and 1944. Then in official documents during much of its history, the name appears in Latin form, Leopolis. The variations continue but the author has been kind and generally used the present day more English names such as Warsaw and Cracow, these names make more sense than the Polish equivalents.

Krakowiec is the small town near the Polish border on a lake and fortyfive Km from Lviv. Over the centuries it has had a very troubled life with political problems and religious differences. A dominance of Jews who were often successful particularly in commerce but then were suppressed by other powers. Of the 20th century the entire area was vastly affected by first WW1 then by WW2. Many Jews escaped to America in the 1930's between the wars, others to Palestine.

The entire Ukraine area appears to have prospered since the collapse of the Soviet Union, what has now occurred is not dissimilar to what has happened from time to time over the period from the 1700's. It is a sad story, a land that could be doing so well yet the neighbouring power seems fit to invade. What justification is beyond my understanding, surly there would be a better way. In this enlightened age war can hardly be justified, it is but manmade suffering and a cruel waste of people's resources.

I will read the hundred or so of the pages remaining in this well researched and written book, I guess it will offer very little comfort if any. Wouldn't it be great if Mr. Putin could decide to withdraw his troopes and set about to help rebuild this fertile land, a land that could well be the breadbasket of the world, or at least to part of the world, as it is since November 2022 some eight million Ukraines have fled the country, many passing through Krakowiec into Poland. I will add two photos copied from this book.

'Adventures with Emilie' by Victoria Bruce.

In 2021 Victoria quit her corporate job and took her seven year old daughter Emilie and embarked on the 3000 km challenge of the Te Araroa trail which covers the length of Aotearoa.

This is a story of how a mother and daughter faced the challenges of living with nature and each other in extreme circumstances, at the same time as experiencing our stunning wild beautiful country in all its moods. A must read for all the trampers and walkers amongst us, after all the trail is in our own backyard. And it seems to me that at seven years old it is a big ask to

expect Emilie to tramp 3000 kms. I think I need to read this book.

'The Things That Matter Most' by Gabbie Stroud.

This very readable novel is set around St Margaret's Primary School and it's teachers, and a couple of the students. And it had me hooked!

This author really had me thinking about what goes on behind the scenes of any school, and the lives that entwine within the four walls. I kept thinking about my own primary school teachers who I just saw as the person in the front of the class, telling us stuff we really didn't care

'The Book of Fire' by Christy Lefteri.

This author also wrote the book, 'The Beekeeper of Aleppo' which was a bestseller and is also in the library.

This book is set in a tiny Greek village which is destroyed by fire through greed and indifference. 'The Book of Fire' not only explores the damage wrought by human folly and the cost of survival in our changing world, but also - and ultimately- our powers of redemption and renewal.

With the power and destruction of fire in our everwarming world, this novel is very appropriate for the oncoming years.

Carl Hayman's book, 'Head On' is the latest memoir to join our non fiction shelves. It is the story of rugby, dementia, and the hidden cost of success.

Described by Phil Gifford as 'startlingly honest', this is an absorbing story of rugby at the highest level over the last twenty years.

This latest book is about her grandmother Dolly, and the changing roles of women in society. It is excellent. I can remember my mother doing these chores ... vaguely. I loved reading about it all. Highly recommended.

Book of the Month – Mt Somers Library Title: 'Old God's Time' Author: Sebastian Barry Publication year: 2023 A review by Elles Smallegoor

Not knowing any works by Irish playwright, poet and novelist Sebastian Barry, I took his latest novel 'Old God's Time' home with me, thinking after reading the blurb on the back of the book that it would be a fairly straightforward literary crime detective. However, when I started reading I was brought back to my student days, most particularly to a course on Modernism, in which we all took up the challenge to read James Joyce's 'Ulysses'. It was exhilarating and immensely frustrating at the same time. I had read nothing of the sort and felt unmoored by Joyce's stream-ofconsciousness technique. Barry's work offers much more guidance than Joyce's and yet, throughout the book, you cannot get rid of the feeling of being disoriented and adrift at sea, not knowing when or if a lifeboat will come and rescue you, or whether that is the point at all.

Barry's main character, 66-year-old retired policeman Tom Kettle, feels equally lost at times. We gradually learn he suffered abuse at a Catholic orphanage, and this childhood trauma is exacerbated by the devastating loss of first his beloved wife June (who has her own history of sexual abuse at the hands of a Catholic priest), and then his daughter Winnie and his son Joe. Having left the national police force, he now enjoys a quiet life in his wicker chair on the Irish coast, but his memory is failing him. He sometimes wonders whether dementia is starting to creep in. One moment he is having a cup of tea with Winnie, chatting away. The next, he realises she is buried in the cemetery next door. He sees children outside but they disappear like ghosts. Or is it that his brain is finally allowed to process all the suffering he has been through? And that it is too much, affecting his sense of self and reality? As a narrator through which to make sense of the plot line, Tom Kettle is completely unreliable.

This plot line begins when his former colleagues ask him for help in convicting some "fecking priests" who are under renewed investigation for historical sex offences (p. 17). The reader would expect the usual type of crime story: retired experienced policeman reluctantly joins a younger team of investigators and they all successfully solve the crime case in the end. But nothing of the sort happens in Barry's novel. The visit stirs

traumatic memories, and then memories in general, both happy and sad. As Tom sits in his chair and literally stares at the sea, the reader dives into a symbolic sea of his thoughts: "What a thing to bring to your old friend's door. A new peril of cold cases that he had never foreseen. Enough time goes by and it is as if old things never happened. Things once fresh, immediate, terrible, receding away into old God's time, like the walkers walking so far along Killiney Strand that, as you watch them, there is a moment when they are only a black peck, and then they're gone." (p. 166).



But Barry is skillful in playing

with the reader's patience and curiosity and never totally leaves the "who-dunnit?" question underlying all detective stories. Just when Tom's meandering thoughts become frustrating (they can go on for a few pages), he adds a sentence that suddenly grabs attention: "Could he ever truly tell Jack Fleming what had happened on that mountain?" (p. 166). One of the offending priests was found murdered at the bottom of a mountain cliff. Tom clearly knows more. Or is he the killer? Suddenly, we are alert, reading on to put the puzzle together. What really happened?

'Old God's Time' is forensic in nature. While the investigation of crime forms its base, it also offers up a multi-layered probing of life itself, of ageing (both pysically and mentally), of memory, of the redeeming force of love and moral justice, and of the nature of time and reality. The book conjures up many questions, but we may not always find clear-cut answers.

Talking about Death and Dying

Hospice Mid Canterbury takes its education role seriously. Hospice Mid Canterbury doesn't just help those with a palliative diagnosis. One of its key aims is to build a community that is increasingly self-supporting and resilient when dealing with endof-life.

In previous generations, it was commonplace for people to be cared for and pass away at home, but nowadays, death often occurs in a hospital or rest-home setting. We have become less familiar with death and dying, which can make it more difficult when we inevitably have to face it among our family and friends. One of the ways HMC builds this resilience is with their programme of community education events which are held three or four times a year. Everyone is welcome to attend these sessions free of charge. Topics range from matters related to death and dying, funerals, cultural understandings of death, grief, caring and carers, and more.

The sessions usually feature a range of speakers with varied viewpoints and experiences and there are opportunities for questions and discussion. Recent events include dealing with grief and the real-life experience of carers looking after their loved ones.

Outreach Coordinator Fiona Giles says "These events are so valuable for opening up the conversation on topics that people often shy away from. Hospice aims to encourage open and honest discussion on matters relating to death and dying. Being able to talk openly also gives us all the opportunity to share any worries, fears or wishes that we have. We have received feedback that people are glad they attended and that they learned something new."
