A COMMENT:

The world it appears will never and has never been at peace. It is of course a tragedy, a waste of lives and resources, mankind has fought at wars perhaps on and off for as long as the human race has existed. Currently our attention has been directed away from the Russian Ukraine conflict to the Middle East conflict. What a disaster that the Jewish folk and the Palestinians haven't learnt how to live together in harmony. Why this disharmony leading to brutal fighting has continued ever since the Jewish community was directed to this land following the $2^{\rm nd}$ WW.

I have tried to have some understanding of the problem, a problem which I would have to conclude is well beyond my understanding. This country is Palestine although the Jews would like it to be Israel. It has been occupied by Arab people, but from 1923 it came under British control at the same time the Jewish tribe had a yearning that this land was Israel with Jerusalem being their spiritual home. During and following the 2nd World War Jews in a search for safety were making their way to this land, which they believed they owned of right, they were at that time able to settle there in peace and safety. Come May 1948 the British mandate was to end, while the British had similar ideas the United States under President Truman decided to recognize Israel as a state. In 1947 the United Nations recommended the partition of Palestine into a Jewish state and an Arab state. One wonders to what extent the people of Palestine (the Arabs) were consulted. Following these eruptions or interventions by world leaders almost at once war was threatened. While originally the Jewish tribe was awarded a certain area as time has moved on that area has increased considerably, taken from the Arab occupancy. There never was a state of Palestine, this land was occupied in ancient times by nomadic tribes of Arab countries. Following the withdraw of British rule in 1948 the area was ruled jointly by Jordan and Egypt, Israel became a state although having to defend itself it was successful in developing land and industry plus building barriers (fences) for protection.

The long-term future certainly is uncertain, the Hamas who occupy the Gaza Strip are determined to annihilate the Jewish population, and the Israel's are determined to annihilate the Hamas. Both sides appear to have at their disposal well-advanced weapons of war.

The population at present time Israel's (Jewish) 7,181 million, Palestinian (Arab) 2,614 million, from historic figures it appears the area has been populated to some degree by Jewish folk for a very long time.

In today's Press that is Wednesday October 25, there is an interesting article written by Ben Kepes headed "The Bleak reality that shapes the Jewish people." A Jew himself he writes as to how fortunate he is to be born a New Zealander and was able to grow up in the most beautiful place in the world. Ben states how the Jewish people have existed for thousands of years. For most of that time have had no country of their own and hence have lived across the four corners of the earth. To quote:

"And so, we have overwhelmingly been an "other". Guests in other countries at the mercy of our hosts and neighbours. Maybe tolerated, maybe assimilated, maybe the butt of jokes but still, at some level, an other." end of quote.

Book of the Month – Mt Somers Library

Title: 'Unexpected New Zealand'

Author: Peter Janssen Publication year: 2021

A review by Elles Smallegoor

If you feel you've seen most of the well-known spots in this country and would like to discover something new during your domestic travels, perhaps Peter Janssen's 'Unexpected New Zealand: The Weirdest and Most Amazing Places to Visit off the Beaten Track in New Zealand' is a book worth borrowing from the library.


The chapters are divided by region and, starting with Northland and ending in Southland, Janssen offers on average about 10 different sights to visit per region, making sure he covers various interests: history, nature, culture, literature, science, engineering, art, immigration, and more. Pretty much every single one of the 237 pages of the book is accompanied by beautiful photographs, which makes this a very rewarding and entertaining read.


A glossary at the back explains Kiwi/Maori words that are likely unknown to foreign tourists, such as "hokey pokey" and "whanau" (p. 238).

Janssen indicates that "many of the places are well known locally but are unknown to a visitor who is frequently short on time" (p. 7). So, for us (mostly) mid-Cantabrians, the sections on Lake Heron and Lake Clearwater, the Blackburn Mine in Mt Somers and the Temuka pottery (p. 174-176) may be less interesting.

But there is something for everyone to discover. I was amazed by the story told by Janssen in the Waikato/King Country chapter about the Te Kauwhata World War 1 reparation wine cask: "At the Treaty of Versailles, the Prime Minister of New Zealand William Massey had hoped to receive 10 million pounds, but ended up with just 500,000 pounds, a collection of captured field guns and 136,000 litres of German wine. Five of the casks were sent to the research station at Te Kauwhata to be bottled or blended with local wine and the casks were then used for storing wine until 1994. [...] In 2001 the empty and rotten barrels were offered to the local Lions Club for sale as firewood. Fortunately, the club had a much smarter idea and pulling the casks apart, used the best of the original timber to build a single good barrel which is on display today by the car park" (of Invivo Wines). (p. 55).

This is a book that is perfect for those who like short reads. You just pick it up, select a region or chapter and simply





browse or read a page or two while looking at the pictures. Fun facts and surprising finds guaranteed. And, if you are planning a New Zealand road trip, grab a pen: Janssen's book ensures there are plenty of detours to jot down!



The main south road was frenetic; cars, trucks, campervans, travelling both north and south. Then just before the turn onto the road that leads to Talleys, we had a puncture. Harvey pulled over, nearly completely off the tar seal. He just about took his life in hands getting out of the car, and he thinks the driver's door has suffered somewhat from the slip stream from one of the big trucks. Those big truck and trailer units shift so much air that their passing was just about enough to sweep us off our feet.

Finally he asked the girl if she would mind looking up Newman's number for him. She thankfully obliged and ten minutes later their truck arrived, the tyre changed and we were on our way home again, probably at least an hour later than we expected to arrive home. During all that time, not one vehicle stopped; they didn't even slow down.

Over the years we have often stopped to offer help, on one occasion towing a vehicle from right out in the country somewhere, into Christchurch. A number of years ago were travelling home from the south between Oamaru and Timaru, we stopped to change a lady's tyre. She said she had been waiting for

a considerable time for the A.A. and during that time, we were the only ones who had stopped. Harvey had just finished changing the tyre when with a lot of noise a bikey gang roared past, then slowed down, turned around and came back to see if they could help. But nobody stopped for us yesterday!

Recently the Gospel readings set down for Sunday worship have been based on Jesus new commandment to love one another, to help those who are in need of help. In this modern society of ours, has it become everybody for themselves or were we just unlucky that the caring souls were not on the Main South Road yesterday?


