Remember the fallen on Anzac Day

The public holiday on Anzac Day 2025 will bring some changes to Council services and facilities.

The Ashburton Art Gallery and Museum and EA Networks Centre will both be open on Anzac Day, but the Ashburton Library and civic centre will be closed.

Residents will have the chance to remember New Zealand's fallen soldiers on Friday, starting with the dawn service at the Ashburton Cenotaph at Baring Square West at 6.30am.

Deputy Mayor Liz McMillan will attend the early morning service, as well as the 7.30am service at the Hakatere Marae.

Mayor Neil Brown will be the guest speaker at Methven's Anzac service, and at the civic service and wreath-laying at the Ashburton Cenotaph at 11am.

This year, Anzac Day marks the 80th anniversary of the end of the Second World War.

Temporary road closures will be in place for Anzac Day ceremonies at Baring Square West, for the dawn and civic services.

The art gallery and museum is inviting people to join them for a special Anzac Day talk with Sarah Johnston, at 2pm. The facility will be open from 1-4pm.

Sound historian Sarah is researching recordings made between 1940-1945 by New Zealand's mobile broadcasting units, which travelled overseas with our forces.

She will shed light on recordings the broadcasters made of New Zealand nurses. Courtesy of RNZ and Ngā Taonga Sound & Vision, she will play some of these 80-year-old recordings and talk about the men and women who we hear in them.



On Anzac Day, the Ashburton Art Gallery and Museum is inviting residents to hear the voices of nurses who travelled overseas with our forces during World War Two. The gallery and museum will be open 1-4pm on Anzac Day, with a special talk about the nurses at 2pm.

The nurses' recordings are part of a wider Anzac Day exhibition, Land, Sea and Air, which explores the stories of four Ashburton people who put themselves in danger during the Second World War.

The exhibition will run until 25 May, though the art gallery and museum will close for two weeks from 28 April while its reception areas are merged.

Council is proposing to deliver drinking water, wastewater and stormwater services with an enhanced inhouse Stand-Alone Business Unit (SABU) and wants your feedback ... but be quick as the

consultation closes this Sunday.

We've also investigated an alternative option of setting up a water services council-controlled organisation (WSCCO).

Both delivery models comply with the Government's expectations while keeping our water infrastructure under strong

local control and maintaining the level of service that our community expects.

We encourage you to take a look at our consultation document, which provides a summary of the issues we've considered, the reasons for selecting our proposed model and financial modelling which compares the costs of each option.
