We are proposing to introduce household kerbside food waste collection. Other districts have done so at a cost of about \$50 per household per year. Would you support a kerbside food waste collection service being implemented?:	No
Why?:	Some households have very little food waste due to insinkers. If it is introduced there should be an option to opt out by proving you have a insinkerator, this would ensure food is not still put in the red bin.
Do you agree with the key issues in the draft Plan? If so, which issues do you agree or disagree with?:	Yes
Why?:	Agree waste to landfill needs reducing. But those who will not need a service should not subsidise those who do. Not clear in the draft what is meant by "Kitchen Waste Industrial/Commercial/Institutional =12.3. Residential =5.1. Kerbside =42.7. What is the difference between kerbside & residential? I currently have a large bin for garden waste which is collected on a as needed basis.
Do you agree with the proposed actions in the draft Plan? If so, which actions do you agree or disagree with?:	No
Why?:	I only put out my yellow bin monthly. Red bin could go out fortnightly or longer apart. So for both these bins I am subsidising others, I accept this, but not also subsidising food waste collection, which I will not use. Will the small container supplied by council be able to be stored outside or is it designed to go in the kitchen? Does it have a lid?
Do you have any other comments?:	The question in the draft is "household kerbside FOOD WASTE collection". A number of submissions are replying YES then talk about agreeing to food waste AND garden waste. These are two different questions. Would residents change their answer if they realised that GREEN waste is not included in this draft? If implemented it would require collection on a different day to
