- 1. Work to be undertaken complies with the Canterbury Land and Water Regional Plan Rule 5.18 (copy attached) or if the work does not comply with this Rule, a resource consent has been granted by Environment Canterbury for the work.
- 2. No work is to be carried out until written notification has been received from the Ashburton District Council to proceed with oil application and oil is only permitted to be applied by an ADC Approved Contractor.
- 3. That I will contact the Ashburton District Council office and advise of the proposed day when the road will be oiled.
- That the Approved Contractor may reapply oil, under the condition stated in this application, until
 (maximum 12 months or at the pleasure of the Council). If you choose to
 change contractor within the 12 month period, please notify Council.
- 5. That oil shall be applied only after the grader has formed up and shaped the road to a satisfactory crossfall to shed water.
- That the oil is sprayed or applied in a manner that does not result in pooling or runoff, with a
 maximum application rate not exceeding 2 litres/m² per day and 4 litres/m² per annum.
- 7. That care will be taken during application of the oil to avoid contamination of water races and stormwater drains present on the road reserve.
- 8. An inspection will be carried out post-application by Roading Department staff to confirm that Council requirements have been met during the application of oil.

- 9. No work may be undertaken by the Approved Contractor in the road corridor without first obtaining the necessary Corridor Access Request (CAR) approval from Council.
- 10. Council reserves the right to amend this application and/or approval in consultation with the applicant.

Dust Suppressants

- 5.18 The discharge of a dust suppressant onto or into land in circumstances where a contaminant may enter water is a permitted activity, provided either of the following conditions is met
 - 1. The discharge is only of vegetable oil, or of new light fuel or lubricating oil and is:
 - a) applied in a manner that does not result in pooling or runoff, with a maximum application rate not exceeding 2 litres/m² per day and 4 litres/m² per annum; and
 - b) not within 20m of a surface water body, the Coastal Marine Area, a bore or soak hole; or
 - 2. The dust suppressant is approved under the Hazardous Substances and New Organisms Act 1996 and the use and discharge of the dust suppressant is in accordance with all conditions of the approval.
- 5.19 The discharge of oil as a dust suppressant onto or into land in circumstances where a contaminant may enter water that does not meet one or more of the conditions in Rule 5.18 is a restricted discretionary activity

The exercise of discretion is restricted to the following matters:

1. The actual and potential environmental effects of not meeting the condition or conditions of Rule 5.18.
