Donate your old laptop, for good

Do you have a laptop sitting around the house, less than 10 years old with a charger, that you don't use any more?

It might be slow, chew through battery too fast or just not be suitable for your requirements any more. Whatever the reason, Ashburton's Recycle A Device programme can give it a new life in a good cause.

Recycle A Device (RAD) is a national programme running sessions at Ashburton College, under the guidance of Ashburton Public Library Digital Access Coordinator Sarah Jones.

Students are refurbishing donated laptops and the public library is giving them to students and others in the community who need them.

RAD has also now partnered with the Ashburton Resource Recovery Park so that good quality laptops dropped off at the park by Ashburton District residents can be passed on to be refurbished.

This partnership will divert high quality e-waste from landfill, which saves ratepayers money. A dedicated recycling box with a programme sign is on the electronics bench at the park.

Donor privacy is assured, as devices are sent to Entelar to be securely data wiped. They wipe the laptops to an enterprise grade to ensure all personal and sensitive

information is removed.

Library Manager Jill Watson said that people had been asking how they could donate laptops locally, following publicity about the RAD partnership.

"The Ashburton Resource Recovery Park has now created a donation space for our community. The programme has come full circle with the ability to donate, refurbish and rehome devices locally."

She said the first refurbished laptop was given out last week, to a delighted student who had been borrowing a device from her school. People can apply for other refurbished devices by getting in touch with the library.

Final stage of wastewater extension

Contractors have returned to Allens Road to begin the final stage of the North West Ashburton wastewater extension project.

The \$3.28 million project is providing wastewater pipes to cater for future residential subdivision in the area, and installing a new pump station on Allens Road is the final part of the works.

Infrastructure and Open Spaces Group Manager Neil McCann said the final stage would involve excavations and works in preparation for the tank installation.

"Unfortunately ferry crossing issues and sourcing the right tank for the pump station has led to a five-week delay, but our contractor back on site at Allens Road."

The project is now expected to be completed in the second week of July.

The pump station will pump waste from the new pipes to the town's main wastewater network at Middle Road and will be located on Allens Road.

Allens Road, from Turton Street to Carters Road, will need to be closed to all traffic from now until July while it is installed.

Mr McCann said residents on the closed section of road would still have access to their properties.

"This project has run pretty smoothly for our contractor Tru-Line Civil, with the exception of this last delay, and it is important infrastructure for the growth of our town."

Public Notice Reserve Management Plan

Ashburton District Council is proposing to prepare a reserve management plan for all parks and reserves they have decisionmaking responsibility for.

In accordance with section 41 of the Reserves Act 1977, the council gives notice of its intention to undertake a comprehensive review of all existing reserve management plans to create one reserve management plan for the entire Ashburton District.

The council invites the public to submit written suggestions on matters that you would like considered in the plan.

I hope you've all got your winter woollies ready for this weekend's Glow in the Park because the light shows, food and entertainment will be well worth the effort of going out on a winter's evening.

Our Glow in the Park at Tinwald is a free event for our community and anyone else who wants to come along. It's free thanks to a great partnership that Council has with EA Networks, and because of the support from local businesses that have also come on board as sponsors.

The weather forecasters are predicting mostly fine weather, but it is winter, so wrap up warmly and enjoy the glow.

Hosting community events is important work for Council, not in the same way as providing drinking water or the kerbside rubbish collection, but as part of our economic development and to boost social connections and wellbeing. A good event highlights our district to both locals and visitors, and attracting more tourists is one aim of a draft economic development strategy out now for feedback. It's the second iteration of the strategy, first created in 2017, and the new draft is more focussed on working with businesses in the district. There's also an action plan that includes everything from providing support to young people entering the workforce, to attracting additional investment to the district and better marketing Mid Canterbury as a tourism destination.

Having a strong and sustainable economy is really important – it provides better job opportunities, higher wages and a higher standard of living for our residents. It also provides more business opportunities and can attract more investment to the district.

A strong economy means that as a district we can spend the money we need to have safe drinking water and provide facilities like the EA Networks Centre, with its pools and stadium.

As a Council we are actually legislated with the task of improving the economic wellbeing of our community and so we are currently seeking people's thoughts on our refreshed plan to do just that.

Leading up to this review of the

strategy, we spent time speaking

with businesses, organisations and individuals to get a full picture of the economic development issues facing our district and this has helped us develop a new draft plan for the future.

Our businesses and community may have other ideas to add to the mix so we're keen to hear those too as part of the feedback process.

Rubbish and Recycling

RECYCLING RULES

NO LIDS, OF ANY SORT

With the long weekend coming up, you might have friends and family staying over - please help us keep our recycling ship-shape by remembering hard plastics 1, 2 and 5 for your yellow bin, and no lids of any sort or size.

Lids jam the automated sorting machine; you can recycle lids at your nearest resource recovery park, just not in kerbside recycling.



WAS YOUR BIN TAGGED?

If your yellow bin was tagged and not emptied, that means it contained items that can't be recycled. You need to remove the items indicated on the tag and put your bin out for collection again in two weeks.

Public Notice Ashburton District Plan - Plan Change 5

Ashburton District Council has prepared **Plan Change 5 – Transportation** to its Operative District Plan (2014). The change covers the following areas:

- Consequential amendments to various sections resulting from the implementation of the National Policy Statement on Urban Development
- Provision of mobility parking and cycle parking standards
- Provision for the assessment of high trip generating activities

Updates to the Roading Hierarchy tables in the Transportation section.

Council wishes to invite further submission on decisions received during the initial statutory consultation.

- Further submissions may only be lodged by the following persons/organisation:
 - Any person representing a relevant aspect of the public interest; and
 - Any person that has an interest in the proposal greater than the interest that the general public has; and
 - The local authority itself.

Further submissions must be limited to matters either in support of or in opposition to the submissions and must be in Form 6 of the Resource Management Act 1991.
