Overview - eBooks

eBooks are electronic books that can be read digitally on a computer, laptop or other mobile device, such as eReader, tablet or smartphone.

We offer eBooks through the following platforms which will be covered in this guide:

- Libby, by OverDrive
- ❖ BorrowBox

Please note: due to Amazon's strict licensing restrictions, none of our eBook platforms work with **Kindle** eReaders.

Why eBooks?

- ✓ eBooks are free to check out, just like print books, but there are never any overdue fines! eBooks return themselves when they are due.
- ✓ eBooks can be easier to read for those with vision issues as you can adjust font size, type, spacing and even brightness of the screen. A dyslexic font option is also available that's designed to make text easier to read for dyslexic users.
- ✓ eBooks make reading easy and accessible. You
 can download eBooks 24 hours a day, 7 days a
 week, from the comfort of your own home or
 anywhere else with internet connection. (Once
 downloaded, you can enjoy your eBooks offline)
- ✓ eBooks are portable and take up less space. You
 can carry with you a great number of eBooks
 wherever you go without worrying about their
 weight, which you cannot do with print books.

Overview - eAudiobooks

An audiobook, also called talking book, is a sound recording of a book. An eAudiobook is the downloadable digital version of an audiobook.

Once you download the eAudiobook on your computer, laptop or mobile device, you can then play the eAudiobook offline seamlessly. No more lugging around CDs and fumbling to change the disc.

We offer eAudiobooks through the following platforms which will be covered in this guide:

- Libby, by OverDrive
- ❖ BorrowBox

Why eAudiobooks?

- ✓ They are free to check out and never have any overdue fines! eAudiobooks return themselves when they are due.
- ✓ You can easily adjust the speed of the narration. This is particularly helpful for younger users learning to read.
- ✓ You can listen to the eAudiobooks anywhere anytime, you can be in the mountains hiking, an airplane, cooking in the kitchen, driving or gardening.
- eAudiobooks are so easy to "read", you may find yourself trying out more new authors and genres.

Getting started with eBooks & eAudiobooks

All current members of Ashburton Public Library can borrow eBooks and eAudiobooks for free.

To get started all you will need are:

- ✓ Internet connection (Internet access is needed to browse, check out and download titles. After download is completed, you can enjoy the digital titles without being connected to the Internet)
- ✓ Your email address
- ✓ Library card number and library PIN. If you don't have a library PIN, please ask library staff to setup your library PIN.

We have two different eBooks/eAudiobooks platforms:

- Libby is our more popular platform, it has more eBook content, and is a good option to get started with.
- BorrowBox has a lot of Australian and New Zealand content, and is mainly focused on eAudiobooks, but also has a good selection of eBooks.

These different platforms each have a different collection of titles. Together, they provide access to a good range of material. We recommend: if you would like to try out eBooks, start with Libby. If you would like to try out eAudiobooks, start with BorrowBox.

This guide will get you started, if you need more help, eBook drop in sessions are offered every Tuesday 2-3pm. No need to book.

Examples of devices

- ✓ Apple devices iPad, iPhone, iPod Touch [requires iOS 10+]
- ✓ Android Tablets [requires Android 5.0+]
- ✓ Android Smartphones [requires Android 5.0+]
- Windows phones & tablets [app not available, but you can use Libby in your web browser at libbyapp.com]
- Older mobile devices that are not compatible with Libby (i.e.: not meeting the minimum requirement of iOS 10+ or Android 5.0+). The Libby app is not available for these devices, but you can still access Libby in a web browser at libbyapp.com

Step 1: Install the app [one time only]

- For Apple device users, go to the Apple App Store and type Libby into the search bar, and select Libby, By OverDrive. Tap the Get button to begin installing.
- ➤ For Chromebooks or Android device users, go to the **Google Play Store** ➤ and search for **Libby**, and select **Libby**, **by OverDrive**. Tap the **Install** button to begin installing.

When installation is finished tap **OPEN**.

❖ Step 2: Setup the app [one time only]

Open the Libby appFollow the prompts:

Follow the prompts to find Ashburton Public Library and sign in with a valid library card.

First prompt – do you have a library card? Tap Yes

Next, tap Search For A Library

Type in 7700 or

♦ Tap Sign In With My Card

Lastly, Libby will prompt you to enter your library account details. Type in library card number, tap Next. Then, type in library PIN, tap Sign In.

© You have just completed the one off setup. You are now signed in. Tap **Next** to start browsing the library's digital collection and borrow your first eBook/eAudiobook.






Step 3: Browse & Borrow




Select a search suggestion (if available), or tap to see all results.



◆ To browse for something to borrow, tap to open the library digital collection

\$ At the top of the screen, you can:




- Tap popular it to browse the popular titles. If it's not available, you can place a hold.
- Tap random * to browse through the entire collection.
- Tap available now 12k to browse through titles that are ready for borrowing.
- Tap subjects 118 then tap a subject of interest to browse its titles.
- Alternatively, further down the screen are various reading lists to assist you to explore the library digital collection.

Once you find a title of interest, tap on the title's cover image to open the title detail screen, which has information about the title, as well as a link to read or listen to a sample of the book. To borrow a title, either under or next to the title's cover image, tap Borrow. If you would like to change your loan period, tap the underlined lending period, located above the title, to change. Tap **Borrow** again to confirm. If the title says **Place Hold** instead, it means that all digital copies are currently checked out and you can place a hold on it. Tapping on the see icon will give you details about how many people are on the wait list and the estimate wait time for the title. Tap Place Hold, this will put you on the wait list for the title. Confirm when prompted. (Note: when a hold becomes available, you'll receive an in-app notification and you have 3 days to act on it - borrow, deliver later or cancel.)



How can you tell if the title is an eBook or eAudiobook?

In the search/ browse screen:
Title without the audiobook icon
under its cover, indicates that it is an
eBook. If the title is an eAudiobook,
you will find the headphone icon and
runtime under its cover.
In the title's detail screen:
Format detail (book/ audiobook) is
listed below the title's
description.

Step 4: Read / Listen

Unless you changed the download settings, by default, titles are downloaded automatically right after you borrow them, so you can read eBooks or listen to eAudiobooks when you are offline.

➤ Tap

to see your loans, holds, and tags.

At the top of the screen, you can:
 Tap loans o to find your borrowed titles.

Tap the title's cover image or Open In Libby or Open Audiobook to start reading eBook or listening to eAudiobook in the app.

 Tap Manage Loan to find the time and date your loan is due and see options like Renew Loan and Return Early.

(Note: you can renew a title 3 days before it is due, however, if someone else has the book on hold, you will be prompted to place it on hold instead which means you need to wait to borrow the book again. Borrowed titles are automatically returned to the library on their due date. When they are returned, they are also removed from your Loans and deleted from your device if downloaded. If you finish a title early, you can return it before its due date.)









Tap holds to find all of your holds titles.
You can see where you are on the wait list for each hold and suspend or cancel holds as needed.

To suspend or cancel a hold, tap Manage Hold, then tap Suspend Hold or Cancel Hold.

• Tap tags of to find your tags. You can use tags to categorise books and audiobooks. You can create a wish list tag of what you want to read, your favourites, what you have borrowed, and more. Once you select a tag, you can borrow or place a hold on a tagged title, rename or delete the tag. Look for the tag button beside a title to start using tags.

Extra features

➤ Tap ☑ to see your timeline which tracks your reading history in Libby. Your activity timeline will grow as you borrow titles, place holds and return loans. You will see a list of titles you have borrowed, placed on hold, renewed and returned.

Tap to change the Libby app settings, add library cards, manage notifications and find

solutions to common problems.



Once you open a title:

> In eBooks:

Tap the centre of the screen will bring up various customising tools and your reading progress.

- ◆ Tap Back to go back to €
- ◆ Tap ▲ to change appearance (text size, background lighting, book design or font)
- Tap to search for text in the book, tap a search result to jump to that location in the title.
- ◆ Tap ☐ to view bookmarks or add a note to a bookmark.
- Tap 'Chapter' to show table of content and jump to selected chapter.

- ◆ Tap to go back to your last position.
- ◆ Tap to see a list of your recent places in the title and choose another location you've visited.

In eAudiobooks:


- ◆ Tap Back to go back to €
- ◆ Tap to adjust your playback speed.(0.6 – 3x)
- ◆ Tap to set a sleep timer.
- ◆ Tap ☐ to view bookmarks or add a note to a bookmark.
- ◆ Tap □ to add a bookmark.
- ◆ Tap to rewind back15 seconds
- Tap to fast forward 15 seconds




Transfer eBooks to an eReader from Libby



- You can use Adobe Digital Editions (ADE) to transfer eBooks from your computer to most eReaders.
- ➤ You will need to install Adobe Digital Editions for transferring the borrowed eBooks from your computer to your eReader. Please refer to page 15 &16 in this guide for ADE installation instructions.
- Access Libby in web browser at https://libbyapp.com from your computer or laptop.
- Find your borrowed eBook
 - ♦ Click
 - Click loans 0
 - Street Click Manage Loan
 - Click Read With...





- ♦ Open the "Library" view in ADE.
- Connect your eReader to your computer.
- Your eReader should appear in ADE in the list under Devices on the left side.
- Select the downloaded title, then drag and drop the title across to where your eReader is listed under Devices, this will copy the eBook to the eReader.

- ✓ eReaders e.g. Kobo, NOOK (Note: eBooks only, you will need to firstly download the eBooks using a computer or laptop, then transfer the downloaded titles to your eReader)
- Kindle eReaders (Note: **not compatible** with any of our eBook platforms)


Step 1: Install and authorize the software [one time only - optional]

If you do not want to install the software on your computer, you can skip this step and read eBooks or listen to eAudiobooks right in your web browser. However, this requires an internet connection.

If you would like to read titles offline, you will need to install Adobe Digital Editions (ADE) and authorise the software with either Adobe ID or OverDrive account.

If you would like to read titles with your eReader, you will also need to install ADE for transferring the borrowed eBooks from your computer to your eReader.

- > For Windows users, download and install
 - ◆ Adobe Digital Editions for Windows (for reading offline and transferring eBooks to eReaders)
- For Mac users, download and install
 - ◆ Adobe Digital Editions for Macintosh (for reading offline and transferring eBooks to eReaders, if you are running MacOS Catalina or newer, download and install the Libby app instead.)
- To download **Adobe Digital Editions (ADE)**, go to https://www.adobe.com/solutions/ebook/digital-editions/download.html



Once software is installed, you need to authorize it with Adobe ID or OverDrive account. You can authorize up to six devices with one account. To download the same digital title to additional computers or devices, be sure to authorise each one with the same Adobe ID or OverDrive account.




Use the steps below to authorize Adobe Digital Editions (ADE) [one time only]:

 You will be prompted to authorize ADE the first time you open it. If not, go to Help > Authorize Computer.



- Click Create an Adobe ID or
- To create Over Drive account, go to https://www.overdrive.com/account/sign-up
- Select Adobe ID or OverDrive from the eBook Vendor drop-down menu. Enter your Adobe ID or OverDrive account and password, then select Authorize.



❖ Step 2: Browse & Borrow

- Browse through collection
 - Open your web browser (e.g.: Chrome, Firefox, Internet Explorer, Edge, Safari)
 - Either access Libby at https://libbyapp.com (go to page 7 for sign in instructions) or Go to the library's Overdrive webpage https://southisland.overdrive.com/
 - ◆ Click on Sign in (top right)
 - ◆ Select Ashburton Public Library from the dropdown list (top of the list), type in your library card number and library PIN, then click on Sign in

(Note: Your library card number is on the back of your library card, the number starts with B or ASB, type the B or ASB at the beginning and if there is a suffix, /A etc., remember to type this as well. If you don't have a library PIN, please ask library staff to setup your library PIN.)

You will be taken back to the Overdrive homepage after you sign in. From here you can type your search term (title, author, or series name) into the search box to search for a specific title or you can browse by Subjects / Collections






Borrowing and Reserving titles

- You can find a title's format under its cover.

 ☐ EBOOK icon indicates it is an eBook.

 ☐ AUDIOBOOK icon indicates it is an eAudiobook.
- You can find a title's availability above its cover. (the banner along the top of the title cover image)

WAITLIST – the title is currently checked out to someone else. Click PLACE A HOLD to reserve the title and be notified by email when it's available. If there isn't a saved email address for your account, enter and confirm when prompted. When the hold is available for you, you'll get a notification and can borrow it from your Holds page (under or My account). AVAILABLE – the title can be checked out immediately. Click BORROW





Step 3: Read / Listen / Transfer



- To read / listen in the browser

 - ◆ Then, click the Read now in browser / Listen now in browser button to begin reading / listening immediately. (Note: there are no downloads or software required.)
- To read offline
 - Go to your Loans page (under or My account).
 - ◆ Then, click the **Download** button. The downloaded eBooks will open in Adobe Digital Editions.
- To transfer eBooks to eReaders (optional)
 - Connect your eReader to your computer.
- Open the downloaded eBooks in Adobe Digital Editions (ADE), open the "Library" view (click the Library button in the top-left corner). From there, drag and drop the eBooks into your eReader, which should appear on the left under "Devices". You may need to accept a file transfer prompt on your eReader in order for it to appear in ADE. Once the transfer is complete, you can disconnect your eReader and start reading. (Note: In most cases, your eReader will be automatically authorized when you transfer books from ADE to the eReader. Your ADE authorization is applied to the eReader during the transfer process.)



- For Apple device users, go to the **Apple App Store** And type **BorrowBox** into the search bar. Tap the **Get** button to begin installing.
 - For Chromebooks or Android device users, go to the Google Play Store ▶ and search for BorrowBox. Tap the Install button to begin installing.







- ⇒ A search results page (sorted by format) will then be shown which lists all titles relating to your search.
- ⇒ Tap eAudiobooks or eBooks or ePress to select your preferred format. You can also filter the results to titles that are available to borrow immediately by tapping the Available only box.


Alternatively, you can browse through a curated selection of categories to find titles you might enjoy. To do this, tap on eAudiobooks or eBooks or ePress.




A list of options will appear on the top:


- categorised by target age group (Adult/ Young Adult/ Children)
- Featured (eg: New releases, Popular reads, Top downloads)
- Categories (eg: NZ authors, Award winners, Australian authors)
- Genres (eg: Australian fiction, Autobiography, Crime & Thriller)
- All Releases (the entire collection)







Tap RESERVE to reserve on loan titles.
 Confirm when prompted. (Please note that reserves count towards your loan limit, but you can free up a loan by cancelling a reserve.)

Step 4: Read / Listen

- > Tap My Loans (bottom left) to find your borrowed titles.
- Tap the title cover you would like to read/ listen to
- You can start reading/ listening if the title is already downloaded. If when borrowed, you selected keep browsing, you will now have to download the title. Tap on Download eBook (under title cover) or tap (under the title cover) to download eAudiobook.






- eAudiobooks
- Usually, audiobooks are broken down into multiple tracks (chapters), when downloading, you can choose to download all tracks or one track at a time.
- You can see your progress of the audiobook and the progress in the current track.
- Tap ► to play audiobook.
- Tap b to rewind back 30 seconds.
- ◆ Tap ⁶ to fast forward 30 seconds.
- ◆ Tap I to go back to previous track.
- Tap ►I to go forward to next track.
- ♦ With the playback speed options, you can enjoy eAudiobooks at your own pace. To change the playback speed, tap 1.00x Speed (bottom left) then choose a pre-set speed (0.50-3x).
- With the sleep timer option, the audio will stop at a set time. To set a sleep timer, tap Sleep (bottom right) then choose a pre-set timer (10-60 minutes or at the end of the track)







eBooks

Simply tap or flick your finger near the right margin of the page to turn to the next page and tap near the left margin of the page to turn back to the previous page.

Borrow

- Tap the middle of the page to show options to search text, change font, bookmark and more.
 - Tap Q to search for every reference in the title. (e.g.: search for "cookies", the search result will show you all locations that "cookies" appeared in the title)
 - Tap AA to change font type and size. (the types of fonts available depend on the device used) You can also change the background theme, brightness, text alignment, page margins and line spacing.

Tap to see the table of contents. Tap a chapter in the list to jump to it.

- Use the scroll bar to jump to a specific page number.
- Tap ►I to skip to next chapter.
- ◆ Tap to go back to previous chapter.
- Tap to add page to bookmark and tap to bring up all the bookmarked pages.

- ✓ MP3 Players / iPod (Note: eAudiobooks only, you will need to firstly download the eAudiobooks using a computer or laptop, then transfer the downloaded titles to your MP3 player / iPod)
- ✓ eReaders e.g. Kobo, NOOK
 (Note: eBooks only, you will need to firstly download the eBooks using a computer or laptop, then transfer the downloaded titles to your eReader)
 - Kindle eReaders (Note: not compatible with any of our eBook platforms)

Step 1: Install and authorize the software [one time only]

- PeBooks download You will need the Adobe Digital Editions (ADE) software to read eBooks on your device or transfer it to your eReader device. Please refer to page 15 &16 in this guide for ADE installation instructions.
- eAudiobooks download You can save, copy and listen to eAudiobooks borrowed from BorrowBox onto any Apple or Windows devices without any need for additional software.

❖ Step 2: Browse & Borrow

- Browse through collection
- Open your web browser (e.g.: Chrome, Firefox, Internet Explorer, Edge, Safari)
- Go to the library's BorrowBox webpage https://ashburton.borrowbox.com
- ♦ Click on sign In (top right)
- ◆ Type in your library card number and library PIN, then click on Sign in (Note: Your library card number is on the back of your library card, the number starts with B or ASB, type the B or ASB at the beginning and if there is a suffix, /A etc., remember to type this as well. If you don't have a library PIN, please ask library staff to setup your library PIN.)
- You will be taken back to the BorrowBox homepage after you sign in. (If this is the first time you have signed in, then you may be taken to a different page asking for your email address)
- ♦ From here you can:
 - click on to browse for eBooks
 - click on to browse for eAudiobooks
 - click on to search for a specific title by keyword, title, author or narrator.
 - click on My Loans to view and download loan items
 - click on My Reading Lists to view items you added to the reading lists.

Step 3: Download / Transfer

Borrow Box.

- Download eBooks to read
 - If when borrowed, you selected keep browsing, you will now have to download the title.
 - ♦ Go to My Loans

 - ◆ At the end of a loan period, all eBook files will automatically expire and can't be read any more on any device. If you try to open an expired eBook in ADE, it will give you the option to delete it. (Note: In the mobile apps, expired eBooks are deleted automatically at the end of the loan period.)
- To transfer eBooks to eReaders (optional)
 - ◆ Open the "Library" view in ADE.
 - Connect your eReader to your computer.
 - ♦ Your eReader should appear in ADE in the list under Devices on the left side.
 - Select the downloaded title, then drag and drop the title across to where your eReader is listed under Devices, this will copy the eBook to the eReader.

Download eAudiobooks to listen

- If when borrowed, you selected Box.
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
