

List of evidence to be submitted by the operator of Land Borne Inflatable Device application for the authorisation to operate.

1. Ensure that your LBI complies with Australian Standard 3533.4.1 – 2005 (or later) Land-Borne Inflatable
 - ⇒ Provide evidence of label on the LBI (picture) and a copy of manufacturer instructions.
2. Undertake hazard and risk assessments: identifying site specific hazards (such as the terrain you are setting the ride up on) and other hazards.
 - ⇒ Provide hazard register and list of controls for each hazard.
3. Ensure a control and supervision plan is in place for:
 - structural integrity,
 - stability,
 - ground stability,
 - access,
 - egress,
 - maximum number of participants (load),
 - participants minimum and maximum height,
 - participant maximum weight,
 - approved blower system,
 - minimum number of fully trained and authorized on-duty operators,
 - approved tether system (minimum/maximum anchorage point),
 - specified maximum wind speed gust,
 - accurate anemometer on site (wind measurements),
 - inspections and results log,
 - supervision an operation as per AS 3533.4.1,
 - incident/accident reporting procedure and register,
 - electric leads and plugs compliant, and safety covered,
 - controlled rates of deflation,
 - minimum and maximum inflation air pressure and means of monitoring.
 - ⇒ Provide documented evidence for the above (SOP for example for checking the device before operating, SOP for starting and stopping the device, SOP operating the device under normal conditions, safety rules for participants, etc.)
4. Ensure strong emergency plan is in place:
 - ⇒ Provide emergency procedure if the LBI device is rising above ground level by unexpected gust/wind event.
 - ⇒ Provide emergency procedure if LBI device is deflating.
 - ⇒ Provide emergency procedure to evacuate LBI device (how to remove any participants trapped inside the device)
 - ⇒ Provide emergency procedure to call emergency services – point of contact – first aid trained operator identified – emergency access.
5. Ensure adequate training has been provided:
 - ⇒ Provide a checklist of the subjects covered during, sign off by trainer and trainee.
 - ⇒ Acknowledgement the LBI is only operated by a competent person who has acquired through training, qualification or experience the knowledge and skills to carry out the task.

6. Ensure adequate maintenance and inspection has been completed.
⇒ Provide schedule maintenance and report of last inspection (<1year old).

7. Acknowledgment that the person with management or control of the amusement device must ensure:
 - ✓ The LBI device is checked before it is operated on each day it is to be used.
 - ✓ The LBI device is operated without participant before it is operated each day it is to be used with participant.
 - ✓ The daily checks and operation of the amusement device without participants are recorded in the logbook.
 - ✓ The operator of the device is clearly identifiable, for example, through an identification card, badge, or clothing. In addition, a record of the operator having completed instruction and training and being determined as competent to operate the device must be included in the logbook for the device.

Obligation for the LBI device operator and/or owner to disclaim to ADC or representative if any prohibition notice has been previously issued for the LBI.

Those documents must be reviewed (date validity, content, sign off) for compliance regards AS 3533.4.1-2018 by ADC or representative before issuing authorization to operate.
