EA Networks Centre & Surrounding Land 30 Year Draft Masterplan

There has always been an idea for the EA Networks Centre and the surrounding land to grow into a sporting hub for the district.

Over the last few years, Council has been talking with local sport and recreation groups to form a vision of what development could look like over the next 30 years.

We now want to hear what our community thinks. Find out more about the draft Masterplan and have your say inside.

Introduction

The EA Networks Centre is 100% owned and operated by Council. It features four indoor pools, four indoor courts, two outdoor courts and a fully equipped fitness centre.

The EA Networks Centre was opened on 9 May 2015, it was a \$35 million, council-community project that had been in the making since 2007. The Ashburton Stadium Complex Trust drove fundraising efforts and together with the community, raised \$5 million dollars.

The initial site selection, building design and subsequent land purchases by Council were made with an eye to the future, with the intention of expanding the current centre to create a larger sporting hub.

EA Networks Centre plays an important role in making our district a great place to live. We know that this asset is valued by the community, it contributes to our wellbeing and provides significant economic benefit for our district when larger events are held.

To get the best outcome for generations to come, we need a plan that ensures development at the site is logical, supported by the community and keeps the centre relevant to our growing and changing district.

We encourage you to have your say on what you think about the proposed plan for the next 30 years.

We are accepting feedback until Sunday 28 April.

How will the plan be actioned?

This plan proposes where we see the development of EA Networks Centre heading over the next 30 years. It aims to provide an overall vision to help guide future projects in the area.

It is important to note that many of the individual projects identified within this draft plan are not currently funded. When the need exists and funding is available, the identified projects will be included in a future Long-Term Plan or Annual Plan, and community consultation will occur as part of this process.

Why do we need a plan?

The Play, Active Recreation and Sport Strategy adopted in 2022 identified the need to complete a stocktake of sporting groups' current and future needs. In 2023, we completed a utilisation study of sports facilities and Council land across the district. The study showed that some areas of the EA

Networks Centre are already being used at capacity during peak times, and that the growth of some sports will be limited due to the size of current facilities. This shows there is a need for more space for both current and future generations.

While the Masterplan aims to increase capacity for areas struggling to meet current and projected demand (such as the indoor court space), we also wanted to add more active recreation and play activities within the plan to join the existing disc golf course and outdoor court space (such as a mini golf course, a hydroslide and allocated space for play within the stadium).

The purpose of the Masterplan is to show the community what can be achieved on the land we currently own. If implemented, it will ensure staged development of the proposed projects, resulting in a future-proofed, cohesive and well utilised community asset. The plan will also prevent adhoc, unplanned development and help us to maximise the space available.

Current and future proposed projects

(including those proposed in the draft Long-Term Plan 2024-34)

The following projects are current projects already happening, or those proposed to be included in the draft Long-Term Plan (LTP) 2024-34, which we are currently consulting on.

Vehicle entrance widening (19)		
A project to widen and add an additional lane at the existing vehicle entrance has been included in our proposed Draft Long- Term Plan 2024-34. This has been proposed due to current challenges when exiting the EA Networks Centre car park onto State Highway 77 at peak times.	2024/25 (Year 1 of draft LTP)	\$155,000
Solar farm (24)		
The draft Masterplan includes a proposed one hectare solar farm, which has been designed to produce enough electricity to power the EA Networks Centre and secure the financial energy spend of the facility. In time this is expected to increase the sustainability and fix a key operating cost for the the facility.	2027/28 (Year 4 of draft LTP)	\$65,000
Internal building changes		
Included in our draft LTP budget is a project to make some internal changes to the EA Networks Centre building. We are proposing to reconfigure some of existing office and staff spaces to include a <u>100sqm</u> studio that could be used for a number of activities including dancing or yoga. The project would also includes moving the staff room to the opposite end of the building. Since this project is already included in proposed budgets, it is not included as part of this Masterplan.	2024/25 (Year 1 of draft LTP)	\$325,000
Outdoor sand court (17)		
A minor project scheduled to be completed in the 2023-24 year is an outdoor sand court that the community can use. As this is to be completed before June 2024, it is not included in the draft Long-Term Plan 2024-34.	2023/24	\$30,000
Oak grove steps		
We have also recently installed steps that join the Oak Grove footpath to the EA Networks Centre.	2023/24	\$28,000

Stadium extension (S2C or S3C)			
A stadium extension has been included in the draft masterplan due to the high usage that we are already seeing in the stadium. We have also heard from key stakeholders that capacity here is already an issue and sport growth and participation is being curtailed. A stadium extension also has the positive economic flow-on effect of bringing additional tournaments and events to Ashburton. This draft Masterplan includes two options for the stadium extension – an extension of two courts, or an extension of three courts, and Council's preferred option is the three court extension. This is what has been included as part of the draft Long-Term Plan 2024-34. Aquatic extension (AQ)			
 The 2023 Utilisation Study identified that the indoor pool at EA Networks Centre had high levels of utilisation, at times the learn to swim pool size is at capacity, and that this is an activity with a growing need. The indoor pool extension included in this plan would relieve the capacity issues year around, whereas the outdoor pool option would only assist in the summer months when operating. The masterplan allows space for the following activities; an additional indoor pool or an outdoor pool, a hydroslide, wet/dry climbing wall, wet obstacle course and splash deck designed for older children. Council's current proposal involves an outdoor pool with the possibility of an integrated splash area, and this has been included in the draft Long-Term Plan 2024-34. This project was preferred over the option to rebuild Tinwald Pool due to ongoing operational efficiencies. Other projects

Hockey turfs

The masterplan includes two new artificial turfs, labelled as (5) in the draft plan. The current hockey turf is an area that was identified in the Utilisation Study as having high levels of use. The proposed turfs could service hockey and potentially other recreation opportunities. The turfs are proposed to be on an angle for optimal daylight conditions.

Multi-purpose sports fields

Two multi-purpose sports fields are included as part of the proposed vision, labelled as (8) in the draft plan. It is expected that these fields may be used for a variety of sports such as rugby, league, football or softball. The sportsfields are proposed to be on an angle for optimal daylight conditions.

Mini golf course

The plan includes a mini golf course (16). The current vision is that the course would not be staffed, and users could either bring their own golf balls and clubs or hire them at the EA Networks Centre reception, which is the same model as the disc golf course at Smallbone Drive.

This is included in the plan as it has been identified as a gap in the Ashburton District, and due to the low/no charge we expect the community would enjoy it.

Playground equipment

Playground equipment has been included as part of the plan (23) to provide an opportunity

for spontaneous play and entertainment for younger family members. This reflects what has been set out in the Play, Active Recreation and Sport Strategy 2022.

Outdoor courts

With the existing outdoor courts proposed to be built over by the stadium extension project, it is important to replace these community courts which are free for all to use. When tournaments are on, these courts are also used for additional space and warm up areas. These are labelled as (22) in the draft plan.

Vehicle entrances, parking and drop off areas

An additional vehicle entrance is included as part of the plan (1), as well as widening of the current entrance (19). Additional car parking is also part of the vision, and is proposed to have an extra 403 parking spaces (2 & 3), as well as a drop off area for buses (4) and service vehicle access within the sports field area (11). These projects are proposed as they are seen as necessary to support the future development and increasing number of visitors to the sports hub as a whole.

Disc golf

The existing disc golf course has been identified as (21) in the draft Masterplan, as it is expected that two of the golf course holes will need to be modified to allow for the other proposed developments in the area.
