KiwiRail Submission on Proposed Plan Change 5 - Transportation

KiwiRail is the State-Owned Enterprise responsible for the construction, maintenance and operation of New Zealand's rail network. KiwiRail is also a Requiring Authority that holds railway purpose designations in District Plans throughout New Zealand.

KiwiRail's national railway network (which comprises of 3,700km of track, over 200 locomotives, 18,100 hectares of land and 1,350 modern and heritage buildings)¹ is a nationally and regionally significant infrastructure asset. The rail network is critical to the safe and efficient movement of freight and passengers throughout New Zealand, and forms an essential part of the national transportation network and the wider supply chain. New Zealanders have invested significantly in the rail network and it is a critical public asset.

The benefits of rail to the New Zealand economy were estimated in 2019 to be in the order of \$1.7 – 2.1 billion.² The economic significance of rail and the critical role it plays in reducing New Zealand's carbon emissions has been recognised by the Government through

its continued investment in rail infrastructure. Transport modal shifts to more climate-friendly modes of transport, like rail, are critical to reduce carbon emissions. As a result, rail is experiencing a renaissance as evidenced by the significant investment being made by the Government to reinvigorate the railway network, demonstrating a strong and continued confidence in rail's current and future potential.

In the most recent budget, the Government allocated \$349 million to replace and modernise New Zealand rail assets,³ which has gone towards a number of major projects nationwide.

The designated corridor of the Main South Line (**MSL**) extends through the Ashburton District and is a key part of the KiwiRail network nationally. KiwiRail seeks to protect its ability to develop, operate, maintain and upgrade this line into the future.

KiwiRail understands that Plan Change 5 covers the following areas:

- Consequential amendments to various sections resulting from the implementation of the National Policy Statement on Urban Development;
- Provision of mobility parking and cycle parking standards;
- Provision for the assessment of high trip generating activities; and
- Updates to the Roading Hierarchy tables in the Transportation section.

Whilst the changes proposed primarily relate to parking, high generating activities and the roading network, KiwiRail has reviewed the proposed plan change documents. KiwiRail broadly supports the plan change however, seeks the inclusion of a definition for 'Transport network' which includes both the rail and roading network. The term 'Transport network' is used throughout chapter 10 including in new provisions relating to high traffic generating activities. Such activities can have an impact on the road and rail networks and therefore KiwiRail considers is appropriate to define the transport network to make this clear.

Relief sought:

Include the following definition:

Transport Network

<u>Transport networks and operations in the Ashburton district of national or regional significance including:</u>

- a) State highways;
- b) Arterial roads;
- c) Rail networks and systems; and
- d) The region's core public passenger transport operations.
