Executive Summary

Tēnā koutou Katoa,

September proved to be a busy and productive month as our teams made significant headway in their planned tasks, efficiently reaching their objectives.

We've made significant progress in our recovery efforts following the recent flooding event and completed the majority of the work during September 2023. A few remaining tasks will need to be deferred until the summer due to the continued flow of water in the streams and rivers and conditions necessary for sealing is met.

Our Heavy Maintenance Team completed all unsealed rehabs and Maintenance Metalling projects and commenced with our Sealed Road Repairs Program, focusing on addressing digout failures and stabs across the entire network.

Failed areas at high-traffic intersections in Ashburton underwent repairs over a couple of night shifts during the month to minimize disruptions, and they were resurfaced with asphalt concrete (AC).

Our Minor Works team has successfully finished installing numerous critical culverts, drainage structures and footpath projects.

Our cyclic teams continued filling potholes and maintaining signs across the network

Our Trading Partners continued their commitment to maintaining the network, which involved sweeping and cleaning the streets, managing vegetation growth, performing line marking, and grading and maintaining unsealed roads.
