I think that you are missing the point. I would rather see emphasis placed on grey water systems and collection of water off roofs for use in gardens (and grey water systems) even if consented by council. This will take pressure off the water network during droughts, plus potentially collect

some excess water during floods. Some industrial sites are high users of water, why not encourage and incentivise the design (including new and retro-fitted) to incorporate water tanks to collect runoff, with the relevant filter systems to take pressure off both run off and our drinkable water supply?
